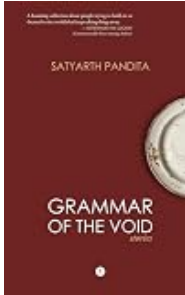

Grammar of the Void: stories

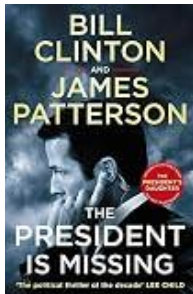

The President is Missing

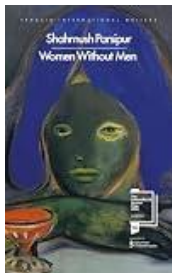
