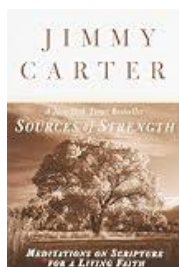

Sources of Strength: Meditations on Scripture for a Living Faith

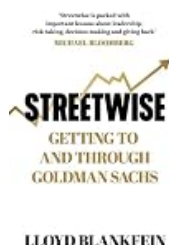

Streetwise: Getting To and Through Goldman Sachs

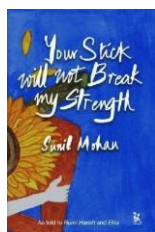
