Christmas in Plains

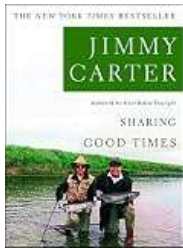

Sharing Good Times

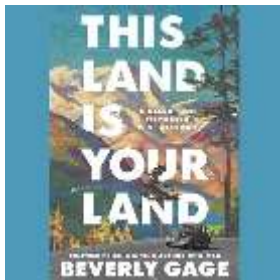

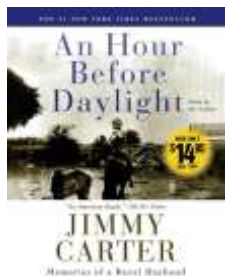
